



Art - Curriculum Progression

Drawing inspiration from the greats - Across all year groups all media studied should begin with an appreciation of / exploration of / exposure to the work of relevant artists and their style. Children should be able to discuss these works of art.

Drawing	Practise shading with pencils of different grades and tones. Recreate and observe images through still life composition. Show facial expression in a drawing.	Record shapes and lines from observation. Use tone and show a range of tones including shadows. Use line direction to experiment with showing texture.	Show movement in drawing. Create a drawing showing a sense of perspective. Draw an object showing texture.	Create a drawing expressing emotion. Use appropriate styles of shading for the task. Show perspective and depth in drawing.
Painting	Mix colours effectively. Explore tone - lighter and darker. Use a range of brushes and implements for mark making suitable to the size of the image.	Use watercolour paints to create a colour wash background. Use different painting and brushstroke techniques for effects.	Use a selection of brushes in one piece of work to different effect. Use marks and lines to show texture. Show movement in a painting through use of brushstrokes.	Mix tints and shades fit for purpose. Use different techniques and brush marks to create atmospheres and convey ideas.
Printing	Make a print through rolling. Make a pattern using a print.	Simplify a more complex drawing into lines and shapes for printing purposes.		Create a printing tile with lines and shapes in varied widths and styles/convey texture/layer colours/create multiple prints from one tile.
